

War, Peace, and Security Certificate

The College of Arts and Sciences' Certificate in War, Peace, and Security (WPS) provides students with the substantive knowledge and analytic skills necessary to understand national and international security challenges and the sources and outcomes of war and peace. War has a powerful and broadly defining influence on societies. Understanding the complex historical, cultural, and political dimensions of the relationship between war and society is critical to living in a world in which war remains prevalent within and between many countries and cultures. This interdisciplinary certificate will position students with the skills to critically interpret and analyze evidence and assess the moral and ethical considerations over time that are involved in decisions involving war and peace. The certificate will advance students interested in professional careers in the private, non-profit and public sectors as well as graduate programs, particularly in the humanities, law, public policy, international relations, military studies, business, and STEM. The certificate is structured to allow students from any major to enhance their understanding of a fundamental condition (war or peace) that drives the contemporary world.
