

INFORMATION FOR TEST 3, March 8th , 2011

- The first part of the exam will consist of 40 multiple-choice questions each worth ½ point* each (I provide a 'bubble' sheet, YOU provide a #2 pencil).
- The second part of the exam is essay, two questions (you will be able to pick 2 from 4 that I will have selected). Each essay question is worth 5 pts* each.
- The total test is worth 30 pts* and 30% of your grade.
- The essay questions are taken directly from the Learning Objectives given for each lecture.
- Note there are 15 learning objectives in total. Three per lecture (11-15).
- The multiple-choice section of the test is drawn from the Learning Objectives (not used on the essay) and the 'guided questions' listed below the class reading assignment.
- You will have the entire 75 minutes of class time to finish the test, starting at 9:30am.
- We will meet in the regular lecture room, Old Chem 525.
- Remember: You cannot 'make up' a test. You get only one test to drop. I recommend you take every test, if at all possible. You can always drop a bad test later.

*Note that 'points' as earned from in class work and pre-class quizzes are not on the same scale as the test points. There will be well over 100 in-class and pre-class quiz points but all together they will only contribute to 10% of your grade. In fact, your 5% contribution from in class work and pre-class quizzes is already posted on BB.
