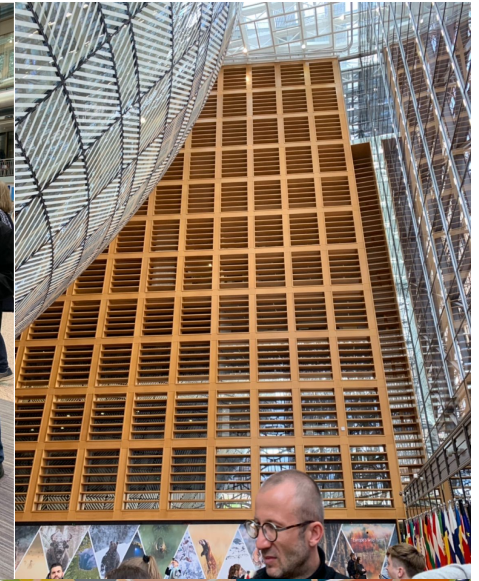

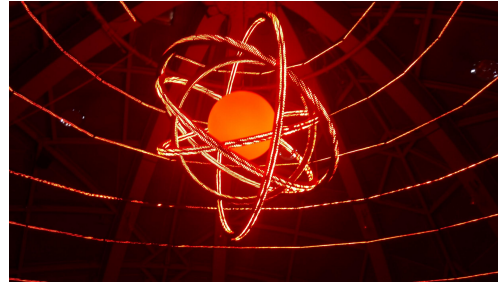
MAY 4TH: EUROPE DAY EVENT

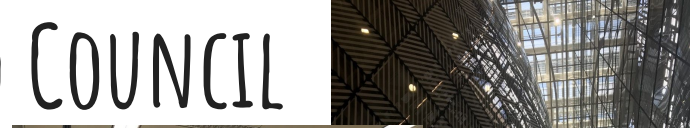
MAY 5TH: HOUSE OF EUROPEAN HISTORY MUSEUM & BUS TOUR OF BELGIUM

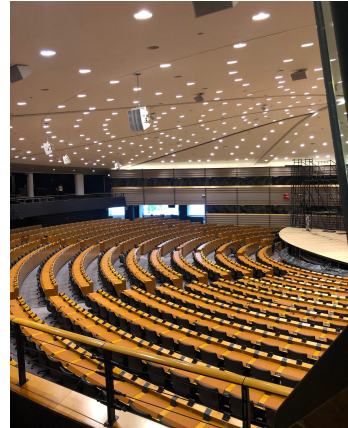
MAY 6TH: EUROPEAN COMMISSION AND COUNCIL

MAY 10TH: PEACE PALACE, ICJ, & ICC

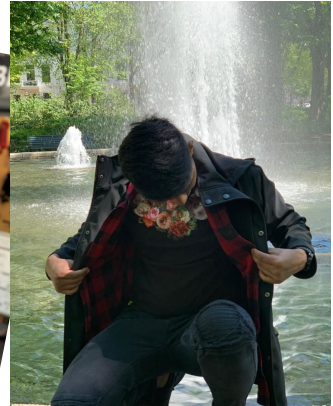
